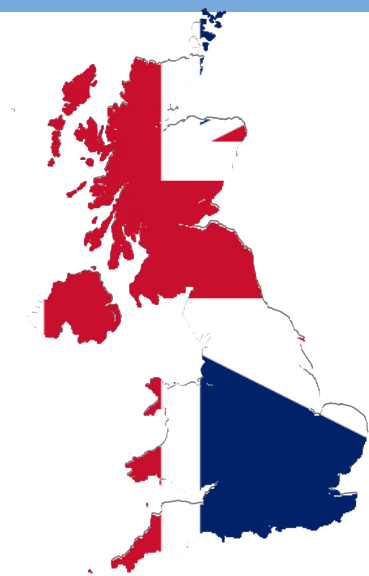

# APRIL 3-12, 2026



- April 3 Departure from Atlanta airport.
- April 4 Arrival Rome airport and transfer to your accommodation.
- April 5 Morning training session with a youth coach from a Rome area pro club. Sightseeing Rome. Visit the Colosseum, Trevi Fountain, Spanish Steps, the Arch of Constantine, the Palatine Hill, the most famous of the seven hills of Rome. Then, take a walk along the Via Sacra or 'Sacred Way', the main path through the Roman Forum that was used for triumphal processions, and visit the temple which houses the altar where Julius Caesar was cremated.
- April 6 Stadium tour of Stadio Olimpico, home stadium of Lazio and Olimpico. Additional sightseeing Rome – visit the Vatican and tour Stadio Olimpico, home of pro team's Roma and Lazio. Visit other famous sights as well (Roman Forum, St. Peter's Basilica, Catacombs of San Callisto, Pantheon, etc.), or day trip to Tivoli where you will find two UNESCO World Heritage Sites, Villa d'Este and Hadrian's Villa. **Evening game vs. a local club.**
- April 7 Transfer to your accommodation in Montecatini, near Florence.

- April 8 Stadium tour of Artemio Franchi Stadium, home stadium of pro team ACF Fiorentina. Sightseeing in Florence. You will visit major sights such as the Duomo, Ponte Vecchio, the Oltrarno, the Palazzo Vecchio, Piazza della Signoria and of course Piazza Michelangelo. **Evening game vs. a local team.**
- April 9 Training session with an Italian Soccer Federation coach at Coverciano, official headquarters of the Italian Soccer Federation including a tour of the facilities. Optional stadium tour of Time permitting, visit Pisa, known for its Torre Pendente (Leaning Tower) and Viareggio, a popular seaside resort on the Mediterranean, or more sightseeing in Florence
- April 10 Transfer to your accommodation in Venice.
- April 11 Day trip Venice. The famous city of gondolas built on small islands connected by bridges. See the famous Rialto bridge and the San Marco church and its vibrant plaza. Possible **evening game vs. a local team.**
- April 12 Transfer to Venice, Milan or Bologna airport and return flight.

\* The above itinerary is a provisional/suggested itinerary and can/will change depending on your group's specific wishes, the final game schedule for your team(s) and any pro game visit(s) incorporated for your group. Sightseeing admission fees are not included in the prices but can be added and pre-booked based on your group's specific wishes. Consult us for more information.

### ROUND TRIP AIRFARE INCLUDED

### SPORT PROGRAM INCLUDED:

We will arrange:  
3 games total per team.  
One training session with an Italian Soccer Federation Coach at Coverciano, headquarters of the Italian FA, including a tour of the facilities.  
One training session with a youth coach from a pro club in the Rome area.  
Two pro team stadium tours (Lazio/Rome in Rome and Fiorentina in Florence).



### ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS INCLUDED:

#### Rome: 4-star Hotel accommodation in Rome.

- Daily breakfast and dinner included.
- The hotel is located not far from the center of Rome.
- Accommodation in triple rooms (3 people per room with two double beds). All rooms have private bathrooms and TV. The hotel has a lounge, restaurant, and bar. Double rooms (2 people per room – two twin beds or one double bed) are available as well at a supplement of \$12.00 per person per night.

#### Florence: 4-star Hotel accommodation in Montecatini near Florence.

- Daily breakfast and dinner included.
- Montecatini is a tourist resort 30 miles from Florence.
- The hotel has a restaurant, bar, and lounge with TV.
- Accommodation in triple rooms (3 people per room with three twin beds). All rooms have TV, telephone, and private bathroom. Double rooms are available at a supplement of \$15.00 per person per night.

#### Venice: 3-star Hotel accommodation in Venice.

- Approx. 5-10 kilometers from the center of Venice.
- Accommodation in triple rooms (3 people per room with 3 Twin beds or Double & Single bed). All rooms have private bathrooms and TV. The hotel has a lounge, restaurant, and bar. Double rooms (2 people per room – two twin beds or one double bed) are

available as well at a supplement of \$15.00 per person per night.

- Be aware that hotel rooms/beds in Italy are smaller than we used to in the USA.



### GROUND TRANSPORTATION INCLUDED:

During your entire stay, a private bus will be available exclusively for your group – 10 hours a day.

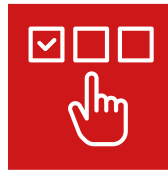


### LOCAL GUIDE SERVICES INCLUDED:

### THE COLOSSEUM

**Full price: \$32.00 per person. Includes The Roman Forum & The Palatine.**

The Coliseum in Rome is a grand structure which was built over 2,000 years ago as an amphitheater to host legendary gladiator contests and other public spectacles. The Coliseum has been partly destroyed and damaged through the years, however, impressive ruins have been preserved and are open to visitors. This grand historic arena was originally built to hold over 50,000 people and many of the original outer walls and facade still stand tall today. Please note that the Colosseum allows us to pre-book this excursion only 12 days before arrival of the group – subject to availability.

### THE VATICAN MUSEUM & SISTINE CHAPEL

**Full price: \$41.00 per person**

Reduced price (school groups only): \$24.00 per person – this is for young people, 6 to 25 years old. Must bring Student ID Cards and a signed letter from the school. A Guided tour of Vatican Museums hold a treasure to be discovered in active and creative ways thanks to the extraordinary richness and variety of the art collections, which embrace the history of human civilization, from the Ancient Egyptians and Etruscans to the Greeks and Romans, from the Middle Ages to the Renaissance up to contemporary times. Schools can choose a didactic activity which is compatible with the school syllabus.

### ST. PETERS SQUARE & THE BASILICA

**Price: Free of charge**

St Peter's Basilica in the Vatican City is an iconic and popular landmark of Rome. Regarded as one of the holiest sites in the Christian world, many make a pilgrimage to the cathedral every year to celebrate Mass with the Pope.

Building work for this grand structure originally began in 1506 and is the burial site of its namesake Saint Peter, one of the 12 apostles of Jesus. One of the key architects of the Basilica was Michelangelo and some of his original drawings for a section of the Dome were found as recently as 2007.

## TOWER OF PISA

**Prices: Leaning Tower \$42.00 - Cathedral admission included**

The Leaning Tower of Pisa is the campanile, or freestanding bell tower, of the cathedral of the Italian city of Pisa, known worldwide for its unintended tilt to one side. It is situated behind the Cathedral and is the third oldest structure in Pisa's Cathedral Square after the Cathedral and the Baptistry. The tower's tilt began during construction, caused by an inadequate foundation on ground too soft on one side to properly support the structure's weight.

## UFFIZI GALLERY

**Prices: Adults: \$38.00 per person.**

The Uffizi Gallery is an art museum located in Florence, and among the oldest and most famous art museums in Europe. In high season (particularly in July), waiting times can be up to five hours. Visitors who reserve a ticket in advance have a substantially shorter wait. Tickets can also be purchased from a lesser-used ticket window at the Orsanmichele that serves multiple museums.

## COOKING CLASS

**Prices: \$48.00 per person – max. 28 people per class.**

Join an expert Italian chef for a memorable culinary experience in Florence, Italy. Explore fantastic authentic local neighborhood and take part in a hands-on 3-course pasta making class. Meet your chef and visit a local produce market first. Afterwards, you will reach the food studio and start your culinary adventure! Conqueror to protect London and assert his power. The Tower of London – an imposing fortress with many layers of history, which has become one of the symbols of royalty – was built around the White Tower.

## THE PONTE VECCHIO

**Prices: Free of charge.**

The Ponte Vecchio ("Old Bridge") is a Medieval stone closed-spandrel segmental arch bridge over the Arno River, in Florence, Italy, noted for still having shops built along it, as was once common. Butchers initially occupied the shops, but the present tenants are jewelers, art dealers and souvenir sellers. The Ponte Vecchio's two neighbouring bridges are the Ponte Santa Trinita and the Ponte alle Grazie.

## SIENA - PIAZZA DEL CAMPO IN SIENA

**Prices: Free of charge.**

Piazza del Campo in Siena is considered one of the most beautiful places in the world. It has a characteristic shell-shape divided in 9 slices; you can admire this form from the top of the tower del Mangia. The Torre del Mangia in Siena requires an admission fee of \$30.00 - U11s Free.

# SIGHTSEEING IN VENICE AND VERONA



## CASTELVECCHIO & MUSEUM

**Price: Adult \$9.00, Child (8-14) \$3.00**

On the banks of the Adige, Castelvecchio was built by the Scaligeri in 1354-55, an impressive defensive fortress certain to remind any rivals of the power of the della Scala family. Crossing the river is the beautiful castellated Ponte Scaligero, a 14th-century bridge that's traffic free and a favourite stroll for local families. The castle's main tower and ramparts afford views of the bridge, the city, and surrounding hills. The castle interior has been brilliantly restored and transformed into bright exhibit space by architect Carlo Scarpa, without sacrificing the integrity or history of the castle.

## ARENA DI VERONA

**Price: Arena Entrance Only - Adults \$14.00, U14 \$3.00;**

Opera Prices ranging from \$28.00 to \$205.00

One of the largest of its kind and among the best preserved Roman amphitheatres, Verona's arena was built in the reign of Diocletian, about AD 290. Only four arches of the outer wall on the north side have survived, but the vaulting seating is intact and in regular use. Its 44 rows of seating can accommodate 22,000 spectators, and in July and August, it is the home of the Verona Opera Festival, one of Europe's major summer music events ranked with the Bayreuth and Salzburg festivals.

## CASA DI GIULIETTA

**Price: \$9.00 – Expect large crowds**

Shakespeare's famous play "Romeo and Juliet" maybe a work of fiction, but that hasn't stopped hundreds of thousands of romantics from making pilgrimage to Verona to see the balcony where Juliet supposedly stood while Romeo declared his love.

This so called Casa di Giulietta, or Juliet's House, actually belonged to the dell Capello family. The house dates from the 13th century and the family coat of arms can still be seen on the wall. The house was in a state of abandon and was overgrown with creepers when the city bought it in the early 1900s, and decided to turn it into Juliet's House taking advantage of the similarity between the names of the house's true owner —Capello— and the Capulets in Shakespeare's play.

## BASILICA OF SAN ZENO MAGGIORE

**Prices: \$5.00**

The large 11-12th century Basilica of San Zeno Maggiore is considered the finest Romanesque building in northern Italy. The beautiful main front of alternating strata of brick and white tufa is flanked by a slender Romanesque campanile (1045-1178) and the 14th-century battlemented defensive tower of a former Benedictine abbey. Although you enter through the elegant Romanesque cloister via a gate at the side, be sure to see the bronze doors on the front portal, with outstanding Romanesque reliefs of Biblical and secular scenes.

You can visit all four of Verona's churches (Basilica of San Zeno, The Cathedral Complex, Basilica of Saint Anastasia & Church of Saint Fermo) for \$8.00 per person.
